


Profile 28 Beaufort Mk VIII A9-332, K-JM

A9-332 served with No. 32 Squadron from May 1943 until July 1945 when it was scheduled for a major service. However, it remained at Richmond until it was stored there in August 1946.

Profile 29 Beaufort Mk VIII A9-490, J-JM

This bomber joined No. 32 Squadron in November 1943 and continued to operate with the unit until April 1945 when it was scheduled for a major service. It was at Wagga Wagga at the cessation of hostilities and was placed into storage there in February 1946.



Beaufort A9-251 ("JM-W") which joined No. 32 Squadron in April 1943. In October of that year the aircraft ground looped on landing at Williamtown following undercarriage failure, as shown. It was damaged beyond repair and converted to components. It has Foliage Green and Earth Brown camouflage over Sky Blue.
